"An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Middle and Southern States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the 17th June, 1864.

Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath that he, together with that Geo. H. Van Etten and City, Mich. each own one fourth

sole owners of the Propeller or vessel called the *S. W. Bradbury* of Buffalo whereof Robert A. Jones is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Propeller of vessel was built at Cleveland, Ohio in the year 1835, as appears by the Certificate of her last Enrollment at this Port, dated June 10, 1872, numbered 189, now surrendered having changed owners. And said Enrollment having certified that the said Propeller or vessel has two decks and one mast, and that her length is 183 feet, her breadth 27 feet, her depth 10 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 676 tons and 87 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Propeller has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said Robert A. Jones having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Propeller has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
