surrendered having changed District and said Enrollment

said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and one mast, and that
her length is 95 feet, 10 feet,
her breadth 17 feet, 10 feet,
her depth 7 feet, 10 feet,
her height 118 feet,
and that she measures 118 tons
and 29 hundredths, viz:
