States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

B. W. Austin of Buffalo N.Y. having taken or subscribed the required by the said Acts, and having sworn that E. Williams of the same place are

(each one half 1/2) sole owners of the Eng Propeller or vessel called the Buffalo whereof John G. Mackay is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Eng Propeller vessel was built at Buffalo N.Y. in the year 1872, as appears by her last Enrollment at this Port, dated June 25, 1872 numbered 208. Now surrendered having changed owners.

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Eng Propeller or vessel has one deck and one mast, and that her length is 42 feet, her breadth 12 feet, her depth 5 feet, her height 8 feet, and that she measures 17 tons (12) and 58 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Eng Propeller has a plain head, and a round stern. And the said B. W. Austin having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Eng Propeller has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
