Permanent

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

George Linn of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with Mr. H. Hollenbee of the same place, are

(each one half 1/2) sole owners of the Canal Boat or vessel called the Buffalo whereof John Brodbeck is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Canal Boat or vessel was built at Lockport, N.Y. in the year 1871, as appears by her last Enrolment at this dated June 14 1871, numbered 191, now surrendered having changed owners. And said Enrolment having certified that the

said Canal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 1/2 feet, her depth 8 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 109 tons and 92 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Canal Boat, has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said George Linn having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Canal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
