Dalcott is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Propeller or vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1872, as appears by the Certificate of David Bell, shipwright her builder. On file in this Office.

Alonso G. Scriven Surveyor said Propeller or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 62 feet, her breadth 14 feet, her depth 6 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures (37) Thirty seven and 13 hundredths, viz: tons
