

Official Number 1416. ENROLMENT No. 2. Permanent

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

James Rettigier of Buffalo, N.Y. having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with it a

sole owner of the Sloop Propeller or vessel called the Alameda Lovell of Buffalo whereof James Rettigier is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Sloop Propeller or vessel was built at Buffalo, N.Y. in the year 1868, as appears by her last Enrolment at this Port, dated May 22. 1868, & numbered 417. Now surrendered having changed Owners. And said Enrolment

having certified that the said Sloop Propeller or vessel has One deck and No mast, and that her length is 35 feet, her breadth 9 feet, her depth 4 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures Five (5) tons and 07 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Sloop Propeller has a plain head, and a round stern. And the said James Rettigier having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Sloop Propeller has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N.Y.
