

ENROLMENT No. 8,

Permanent.

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

A. L. Lothridge of Buffalo, N. Y. having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with Absalom Nelson, and Wm. J. Russell of the same place, are

(each one third 1/3) sole owners of the Banal Boat or vessel called the Carlotta of Buffalo whereof A. L. Lothridge is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Banal Boat vessel was built at North Bay, N. Y. in the year 1809, as appears by his last Enrolment at this Port of Oswego, N. Y. dated June 28, 1872, numbered 294, now surrendered having changed District.

And said Enrolment said Banal Boat or vessel has one deck and no mast, and that her length is 95 feet, her breadth 17 feet, her depth 7 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 100 tons and 92 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Banal Boat has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said A. L. Lothridge having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Banal Boat has been duly enrolled at the Port of Buffalo, N. Y.
