In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, Northeastern, and Northwestern Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and the Acts of the 7th July, 1838, 29th July, 1850, 6th May, 1864, and 17th June, 1864.

P. Q. Locke of *Buffalo, N. Y.*, having taken or subscribed the Oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he, together with *Dolphus G. Austin*, *Rueben Sparks* of the same place, each own One Sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$), and that *Benny G. Hoyer* of the same place, owns One fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) and that *Daniel E. Bailey* of the same place, and *John E. Bailey* of *Toledo, Ohio*, own One fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$), and that they are citizens of the United States, and sole owners of the Schooner or vessel called the *P. Q. Locke* of *Buffalo* whereof *P. Q. Locke* is at present Master, and as he hath sworn that he is a citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or vessel was built at *Toledo, Ohio* in the year 1842, as appears by the Certificate of *D. E. Bailey*, Shipwright her builder. On file in this Office, And *John P. Denny*, Surveyor *Toledo, Ohio* having certified that the said Schooner or vessel has One deck and three masts, and that her length is 135 feet, her breadth 26 feet, her depth 11 feet, her height 10 feet, and that she measures 285 tons and 21 hundredths, viz:

That she is a Schooner *P. Q. Locke* has a plain head, and a square stern. And the said *P. Q. Locke* having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given, in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of *Buffalo, N. Y.*
