In Conformity to An act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An act for enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels;" &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An act to regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and North-western Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes;" passed the 2nd March, 1831,

John P. Place of Ionia County, State of Michigan, Owner
having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that I am a

Citizen of the United States, sole owner of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Martin Van Buren* of Grand River whereof John P. Place is at present Master; and as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or Vessel was built at Sacket's Harbor in 1824, as appears by his former Certificate of Enrollment dated at the Port of Oswego 1st day of April 1836 N. 1. now amended by reason of a change of District & Owners,

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has One deck and two Masts and that her length is Seventy eight feet 30 inches, her breadth Eighteen feet Six inches, her depth Six feet Six inches, and that she measures Eighty four tons Sixty Seven ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has a Square Stern and No figure head.

And the said John P. Place having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Detroit.
