In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels;" &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and North-western Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes;" passed the 2d March, 1831, and ~~Acts passed the 7th of July, 1838, and 3d of March, 1843, regulating Vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam.~~ Also, an Act entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes;" passed July 29th, 1850,

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is owner of one half $1/2$ and W. A. Dillow of Detroit of one half $1/2$ are

Citizen of the United States, sole owners of the Schooner or Vessel called the *Home* of *Detroit* whereof *James Vulona* is at present Master; and as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Schooner or Vessel was built at *Oswego N.Y.* in 1844, as appears by her *Enrollment* dated at the port of *Detroit* the *Twenty fourth day of March A.D. 1851* No. *9* / *None* now *Sumner* having changed owner

And *Sain* *Enrollment* having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has *One Deck* and *Two Masts* and that her length is *Sixty eight* feet *Three* inches, her breadth *Eighteen* feet *Nine* inches, her depth *Eight* feet *Three* inches, and that she measures *Seventy two* tons *Twenty three* ninety-fifths; and that she is a Schooner has *No Gallery* and a *Square* head:

And the said *James Vulona* having agreed to the description and measurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Detroit.
