## Enrollment

In Conformity to an Act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An Act for Enrolling and Licensing Ships or Vessels," &c., passed the 18th February, 1793, and "An Act to Regulate the Foreign and Coasting Trade on the Northern, North-eastern and North-western Frontiers of the United States, and for other purposes," passed the 2d March, 1831, and Acts passed the 7th of July, 1838, and 3d of March, 1843, regulating vessels propelled in whole or in part by steam: Also, an Act entitled "An Act to provide for recording the conveyances of Vessels, and for other purposes," passed July 29th, 1850,

Alexander Gaulley of Detroit Michigan

having taken or subscribed the oath required by the said Acts, and having sworn that he is a

Citizen of the United States, sole owner of the Schooner or vessel called the John Richards of Detroit whereof Theodore Gaulley is at present Master; and as he hath sworn, is a Citizen of the United States, and that the said Vessel was built at ~~raised from the bottom of Detroit River~~ in 1844, as appears by her Enrollment dated at the Port of Detroit the 25th day of May A.D. 1844 and Numbered (66) which Enrollment is lost, destroyed or unintentionally mislaid, and cannot now be surrendered or on change of owners, as appears by the Affidavit of Alexander Gaulley dated June 2nd 1855, and on file in this office.

And said Enrollment having certified that the said Schooner or Vessel has ~~one deck~~ and ~~two masts~~ and that her length is ~~fifty seven~~ feet ~~no~~ inches, her breadth ~~sixteen~~ feet ~~six~~ inches, her depth ~~four~~ feet ~~ten~~ inches, and that she measures ~~thirty nine~~ tons ~~forty~~ ninety-fifths; that she is a Schooner has ~~no~~ gallery and ~~no~~ figure head:

And the said Alexander Gaulley having agreed to the description and admeasurement above specified, and sufficient security having been given in conformity with the terms of the said Acts, the said Schooner has been duly enrolled at the Port of Detroit.

Given under my hand and seal, at the Port of Detroit, this ~~second~~ day of ~~June~~ in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.
